First Premiership 1949

Won the prelim final against Claremont and progressed to the Grand Final

UNIVERSITY will meet Mowbray, Northern premiers, in the State title at New Town ground next Saturday.

Winning the toss, University kicked with the slight breeze and getting into stride immediately, kept Hutchins on the defensive.

University was faster to the ball and after Hutchins had recorded a behind, University broke through in quick succession for Harding, Barnett, and Matson to goal.

Hutchins settled down and, superior in the air, was only able to record behinds before Abbott and Hill reduced **University's** lead to three **points**.

Roy Cazaly's Hat-Trick

IN its long history, New Town has won only three league premierships, and its present coach, Roy Cazaly, has been associated with all three.

Cazaly was playing coach of New Town in 1935, and that was the only time the club won the premiership of the old league.

District football was introduced in 1945 when New Town was runner-up for the premiership.

Cazaly was in retirement when he was invited by New Town last year to assume the role of non-playing coach and New Town took the honours.

He was reappointed coach for this year, and once more the veteran of Victorian and Tasmanian carnival football saw his team take the coveted title. — **DROP-KICK.**

At the first change Hutchins led by 11 **points**.

Continuing its play-on tactics, University was soon in the lead.

Hutchins, settling down, pressed the University back line, Driscoll turning many attacks aside.

Failure of Hutchins' forwards to capitalise on their opportunities found the scores level at half-time — **University, 9.3; Hutchins, 8.9.**

University dominated the third term, and kept the **game** open.

Although both sides had slowed down, University was first to the ball and with a forward line working well, the Hutchins backs wilted.

Match-Winning Lead

At the final change, University, which had demonstrated a great finishing effort in recent matches, appeared to have the **game** won with a lead of 31 **points**.

Hutchins attacked strongly throughout the last quarter, but was unable to bridge the gap.

The University back line combined well and by adopting spoiling tactics prevented Hutchins from having deliberate shots for goal.

Driscoll continued to play a solid **game** for University, but Hutchins, although it only let University across the centre line on eight occasions and prevented any score, was unable to score goals.

It was not till late in the quarter that Gilbert goaled, followed shortly afterwards by one from Hill, who thus recorded 106 goals for the season and broke his 1936 record of 105.

University's lead was 11 **points**, but four more shots for goal by Hutchins went astray, behinds only being recorded.
